- Chaperone and care for your dog for up to 2 hours at the wedding.
- Assist with capturing those special photographs.
- Ensure that your dog has appropriate comfort and water breaks.
- Return your dog to an agreed location, feed and top up water as required.

- Overnight accommodation or pet sitting in your home both pre or post the wedding.

## **Tips**

- Find a dog-friendly venue.
- Check with your registrar.
- Assign a pet-sitter.
- Discuss your requirements with your photographer.
- Ensure that all guests will be aware that a dog is attending the wedding, in case of allergies. A lovely idea is to send out a 'save the date' card featuring a photo of your dog.
- If you are considering a special dog wedding collar or accessory, make sure that it is safe and comfortable for your dog. Let them get accustomed to it before the big day. Certain flowers or foliage can be poisonous to dogs, so it is vital to check.
- The chances are your dog will be interacting with and meeting lots of people. Take a moment to think about how they are with people. Do they jump up, get overwhelmed easily or will they just take it in their stride?

• Some dogs are often nervous in new places so it is worth thinking about how you can try and minimise any anxiety they might have. Perhaps you can take them to the venue/location a few times before the big day to get familiar with it. If possible, try and find a 'safe' space for them to have their crate or bed in. An out of the way corner they can retreat to when they need a time out.
